

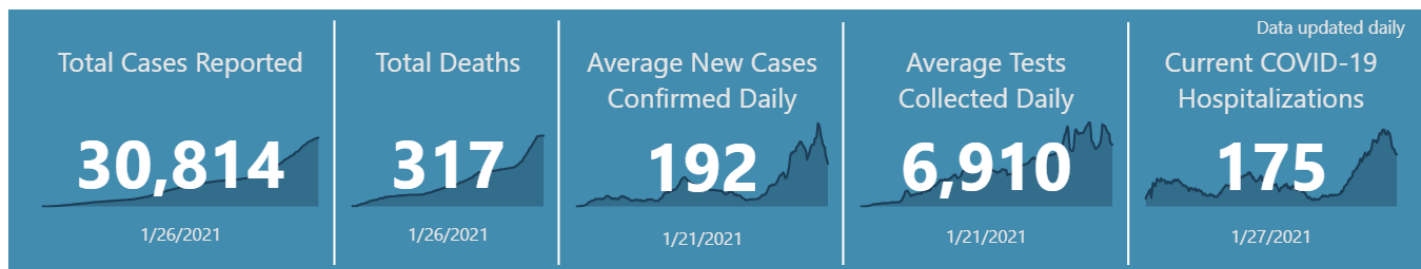


Update on COVID-19 & the City's Response, January 29

Some businesses and activities re-opened this week. The City posted the revised Health Order with detailed requirements to its [webpage](#).

On Friday, the City announced new mental health resources for San Francisco Unified School District students and their families who need behavioral health crisis support. The expansion of the Mobile Response Team bolsters the School District's ongoing efforts to help students cope with complex issues such as stress, trauma, suicide, bullying, depression, self-esteem, drug and alcohol use, sexual health, and relationships.

- The Mobile Response Team, operated by Seneca Family of Agencies, provides a non-police, age-appropriate response for children and youth experiencing behavioral health crises or in need of preventative care.
- When a child or youth is referred to the program, the MRT staff respond with a range of services, including crisis prevention, counseling, help developing short- and medium-term care plans, helping the family find long-term services, and coordinating the young person's mental health care.
