

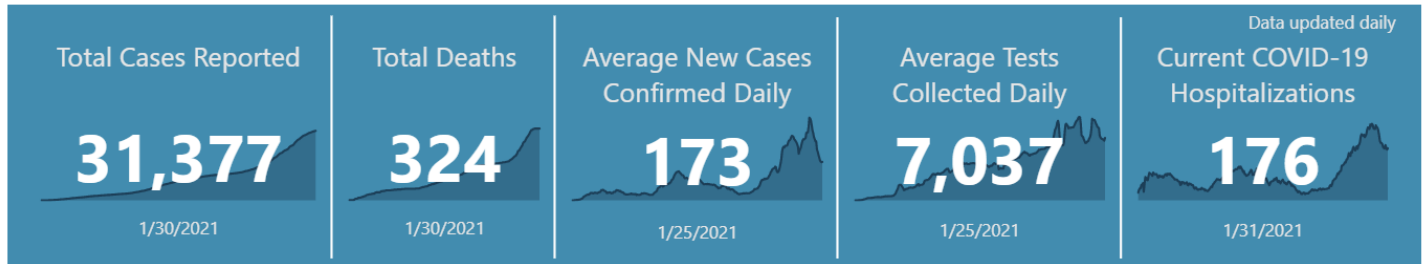


Update on COVID-19 & the City's Response, February 2

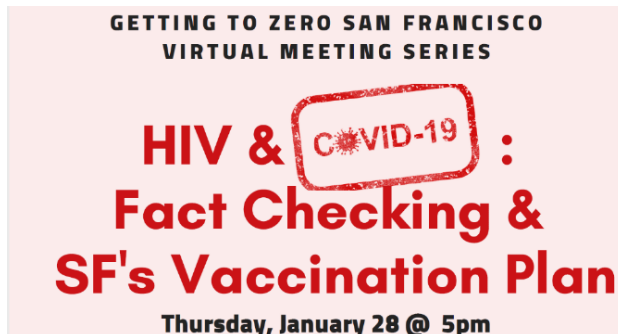
