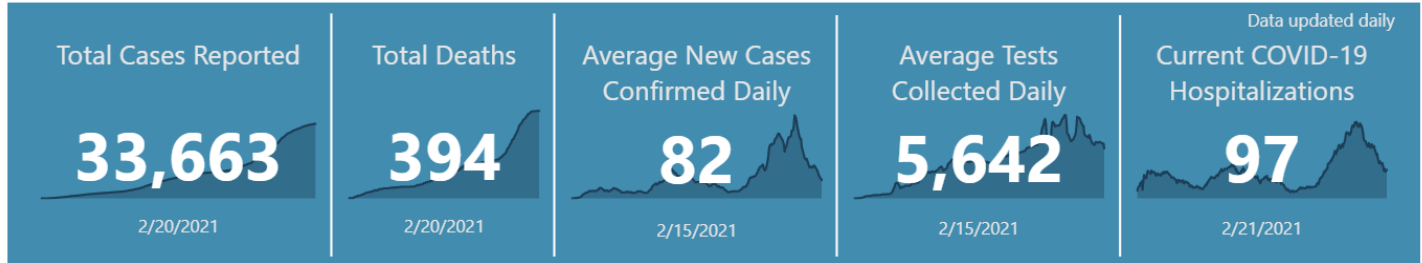

Current Status of COVID-19 Vaccine in San Francisco: COVID-19 vaccine is here, but supply is low

Tomorrow, San Francisco will move to *Phase 1B, Tier 1* of the state's population prioritization plan:

- Phase 1B, Tier 1 is comprised of more than 115,000 individuals who live or work in San Francisco, in addition to the approximately 210,000 healthcare workers and people 65 and older who are currently eligible. The City announced this update on February 9th, read the full press release [here](#).

- Starting **TODAY**, the SFMTA will offer **free** Muni trips and expanded Essential Trip Card credit for customers traveling to and from COVID-19 vaccination sites in San Francisco. Anyone traveling to receive their vaccination will be able to ride Muni to and from their appointment for free, regardless of which site they go to. Read [here](#)!
