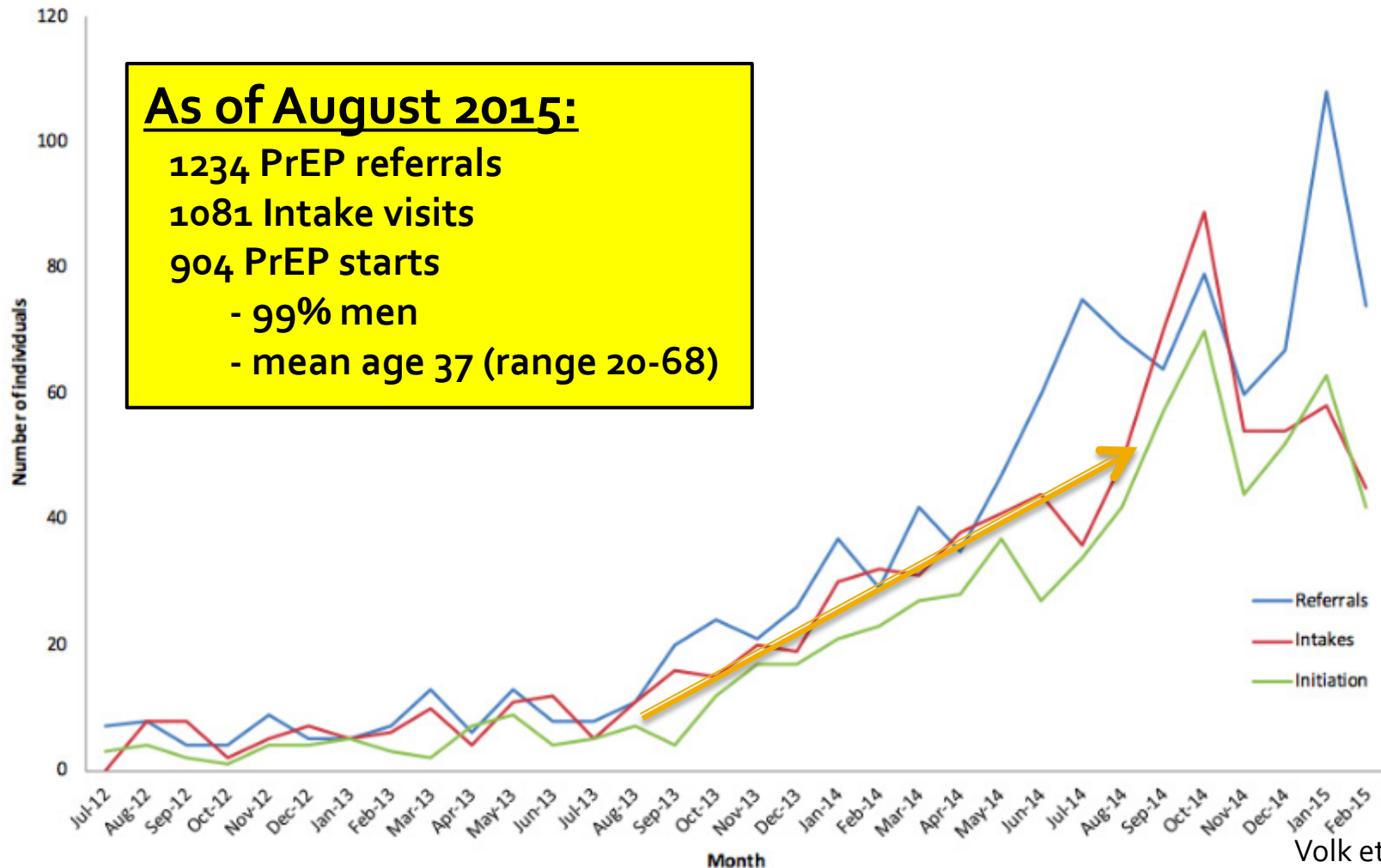
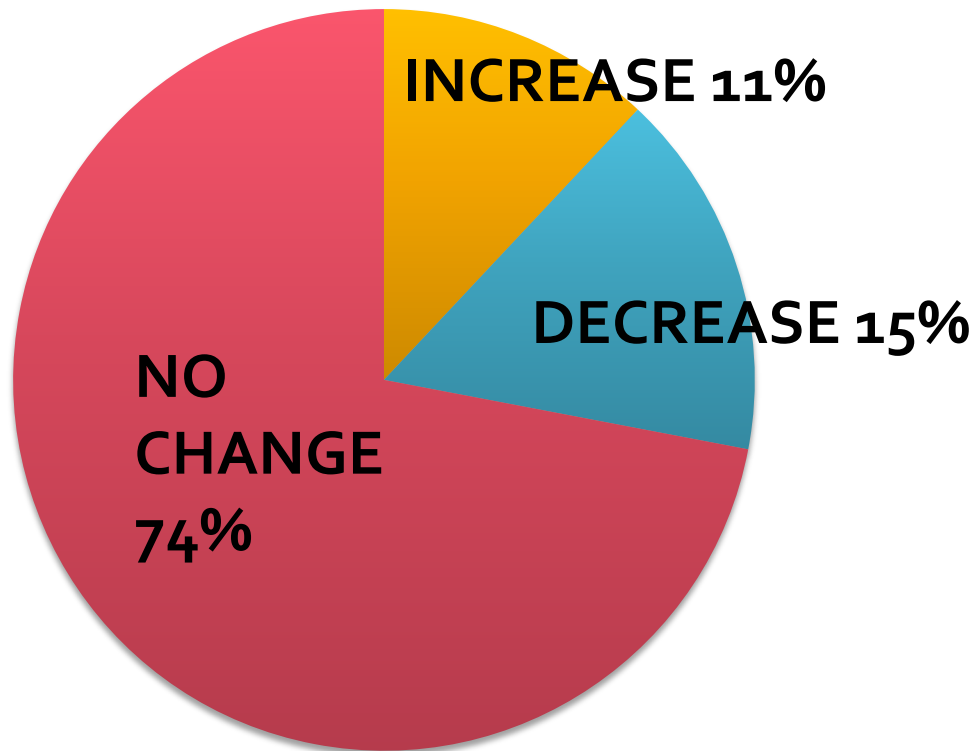

KP RISK COMPENSATION DATA

CHANGES IN REPORTED NUMBER OF PARTNERS AFTER STARTING PrEP (n=143)

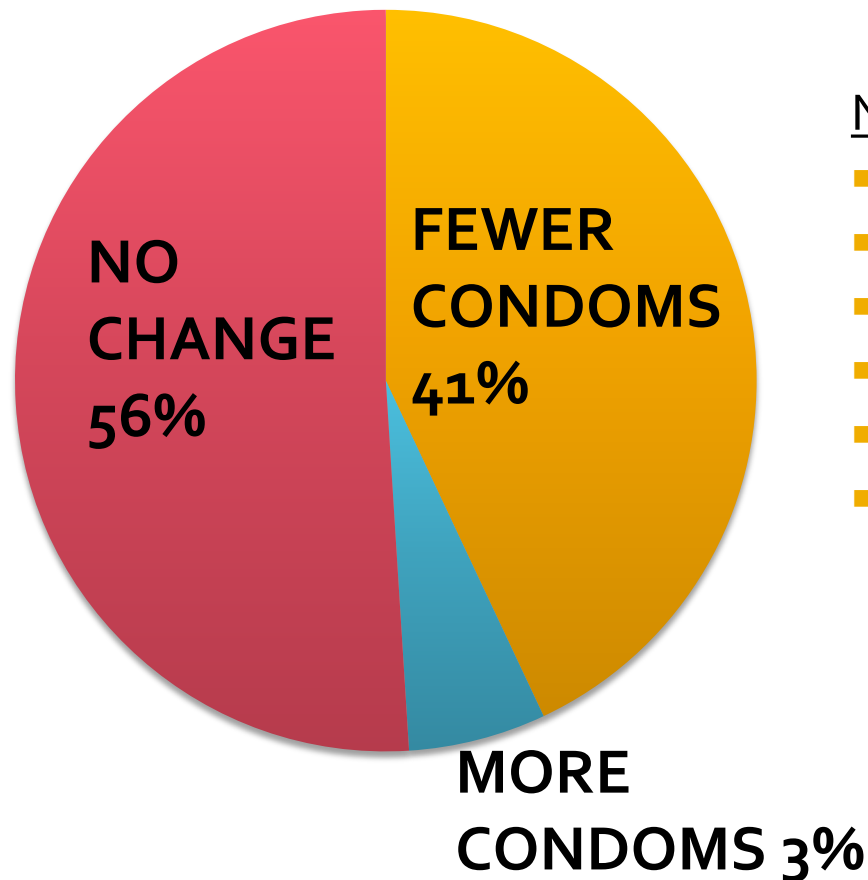


NO ASSOCIATION WITH:

- Age
- STI history
- Condoms 3 months before PrEP use
- HIV+ partner
- Methamphetamines/cocaine
- Adherence

KP RISK COMPENSATION DATA

CHANGES IN REPORTED CONDOM USE AFTER STARTING PrEP (n=143)



NO ASSOCIATION WITH:

- Age
- STI history
- Condoms 3 months before PrEP use
- HIV+ partner
- Methamphetamines/cocaine
- Adherence

KP RISK COMPENSATION DATA

- No new HIV infections despite self-reported decreases in condom use – PrEP works
- Limitations of our data:
 - No control group
 - Fewer condoms ≠ more HIV risk ?
 - “PrEP-sorting”
 - Undetectable viral loads

PrEP WORKS, BUT STD SCREENING IS IMPORTANT
