



November 30 Update on COVID-19 & the City's Response

GTZ-SF will be updating you with some facts on COVID-19 and reminders of how to keep safe, updates on the City's response and links to resources that may be useful.

According to the San Francisco COVID-19 Data Tracker, the County reports **15,522** confirmed positive cases of COVID-19, **160** deaths and **882,066** total tests collected.¹ The Bay Area has **150,550** cases, including **1,962** deaths.² ***SF is experiencing a surge in COVID-19 and has been assigned to the State's Purple Tier.*** Starting tonight at 10PM, San Francisco will be under the State's Limited Stay at Home Order requiring residents to avoid any gatherings (both indoors & outdoors) & non-essential businesses will close from 10PM-5AM daily: <http://sf.gov/LimitedStayHome>.

Effective November 30, the Health Officer has [ordered suspensions or restrictions](#) on capacity limits of several activities. Details and directives [here](#).

- No indoor or outdoor retail from 10 pm - 5 am PST (note that essential retail may operate during these hours)
- *No Outdoor Dining from 10 pm - 5 am PST*
- *No indoor religious or cultural ceremonies allowed. Suspended until further notice.*
- *Outdoor Religious Gatherings RESTRICTED - Total capacity limits up to 200 people as shown in "Gatherings" category below. (effective Sunday November 29)*
- *No outdoor gatherings or recreation are allowed from 10 pm and 5 am PST, effective Monday Nov 30, 2020. (Outdoor recreation is allowed during those hours if alone or with members of the same household.)*


