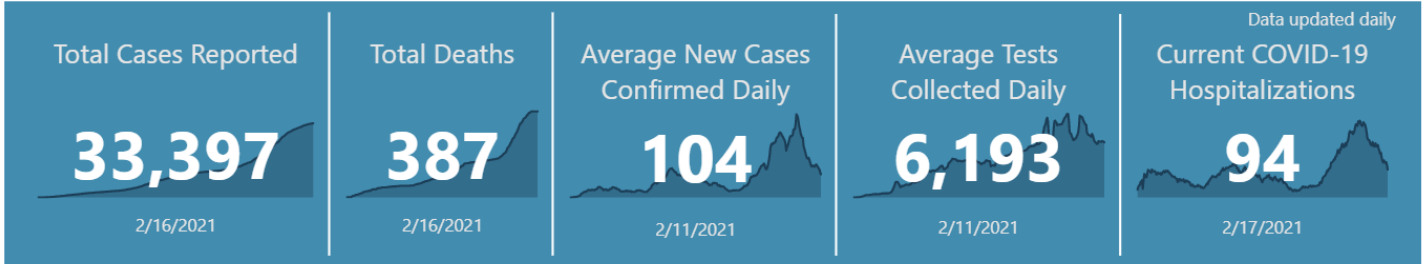


**Update on COVID-19 & the City's Response, February 19**

**Current Status of COVID-19 Vaccine in San Francisco: COVID-19 vaccine is here, but supply is low**

Starting on **February 24**, San Francisco will move to *Phase 1B, Tier 1* of the state's population prioritization plan and begin vaccinating people who work in education and childcare, emergency services, and food and agriculture sectors, while continuing to vaccinate healthcare workers and people 65 and older.

- Phase 1B, Tier 1 is comprised of more than 115,000 individuals who live or work in San Francisco, in addition to the approximately 210,000 healthcare workers and people 65 and older who are currently eligible. The City announced this update on February 9<sup>th</sup>, read the full press release [here](#).
- Starting **Tuesday, February 23**, the SFMTA will offer **free** Muni trips and expanded Essential Trip Card credit for customers traveling to and from COVID-19 vaccination sites in San Francisco. Anyone traveling to receive their vaccination will be able to ride Muni to and from their appointment for free, regardless of which site they go to. Read [here!](#)



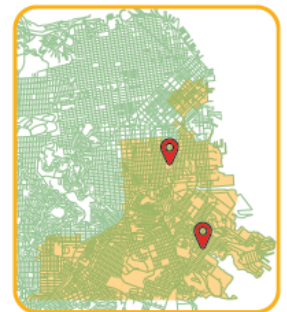
**COVID-19 Vaccines for Residents Aged 65+ in Zip Codes 94110, 94112, 94107, 94124 y 94134**

San Francisco is offering free COVID-19 vaccines for people meeting the following requirements:

- 1) Live in zip codes 94110, 94112, 94107, 94124 or 94134;
- 2) Ages 65 and over

You do not need an appointment. No insurance required.

Drop in from **9am to 3pm** any day of the week at:

or

Zuckerberg San Francisco General 1001 Potrero Ave., Building 30
